PACK 89 SHOULDICE FUND

A revolving fund created by Chris Shouldice, former Cub Master for Pack 89. This fund is to help ensure no boy is left out of cub scouting because of financial difficulty.

Fund Operation

- Upon application for funding by the boys' parent and approval of the committee, the funds shall be disbursed by the treasurer.
- The parent shall be expected to work with the scout in available fund raising activities to pay back the funds received.
- Funds will be allowed for any item needed to allow the boy to participate in the cub scout program. These expenditures shall be similar to: book(s), uniform items, registration, and other items required to participate.
- Optional activity costs are not included in the list of acceptable items..
- A percentage of scout account funds shall be transferred into the Shouldice Fund as reimbursement for the funds received.
- The treasurer shall keep track of the funds disbursed and funds returned to this fund in the monthly Treasurer's Report. There should not be any identification of recipients of funding included in any report.
- Every effort will be used to keep this identification of individuals receiving funding from this fund confidential.
- Problems in disbursing funding or collecting reimbursements shall be communicated to the Cub Master and the Committee Chair in a timely manner. One of both of these persons shall perform any follow up collections required.
- All data presented to the Pack Committee shall be made without identification of the parent or boy involved, unless first approved by the Committee Chair and the Cub Master.
- A form will need to be developed to allow for application. This should include an area for basic, anonymous data, personal detail (confidential), and the method of reimbursement. This is to be signed by the Cub Master and the Committee Chair following an acceptance by the Committee.
